Headache CME Conference

One day Conference on Headache was organized by Department of Anesthesiology, SICU & Pain Management, Peoples Medical College, Nawabshah on December 9, 2010, on various aspects of common and uncommon types of headache. It was a multidisciplinary event in which neurosurgeons, medical specialists, Neurophysicians. Anesthesiologists, Pain Physicians, Psychiatrists, Neurologists and radiologists participated. They discussed in detail, the causes, clinical features, pathophysiology and management of headache. The management options presented by multidisciplinary approach included both pharmacological and non-pharmacological, specific and nonspecific treatment modalities, including interventional approach. The last option was discussed in detail and included abridged coverage of neurosurgical, radiological and different nerve block techniques e.g. greater occipital nerve block, field block of scalp, cervical injections, trigger point injections and cervical facet injections. The conference was attended by a large crowd of under & post graduate students, junior teachers and senior faculty members.
